Racing careers are predominantly outdoors; good for mind, body and spirit and all round health.

Working alongside animals can be very satisfying and this course will provide you with a unique introduction to the racing industry and knowledge of what happens behind the scenes in the racing industry, including stable-hand, trackwork and other industry related roles.

Course includes:

- Handling retired racehorses
- Safely approach, catch, control and lead horses
- Perform routine stable duties, groom horses, daily care and welfare responsibilities.
- Get an understanding of the structure of the racing industry and explore race day operations and racing employment opportunities

The course is designed for people who are:

- Interested in animals, learning new skills and industry specific terminology
- · Hardworking and enthusiastic
- Ability to carry out physical tasks
- Can work in a team environment
- Experience with horses may be helpful but not all jobs need past experience
