Report on Race Meeting held at Gawler Racecourse
by the Gawler & Barossa Jockey Club on Friday, 22
October 2021

RACE 1: HYGAIN CURCULAIN PRO MAIDEN PLATE - 1100 Metres

BRAZEN EAGLE (J. Maund) - shifted out at the start and bumped with TEA RAV (NZ). Commenced to over-race for some distance passing the 800 metres and raced greenly thereafter. Rider reported that his mount raced keenly when resuming today. He stated that the mare was disappointing when placed under pressure and failed to run on and did not respond to his riding. A post-race veterinary examination revealed no visible abnormalities.

DAZZLING HARMONY (A. Jordsjo) - underwent a pre-race veterinary examination as it had not raced since May 2020 and was passed fit to start.

PUDDING (NZ) (C. Jones) - shifted ground outwards when placed under pressure over the concluding stages.

TEA RAV (NZ) (J. Toeroek) - bumped on jumping away. Raced greenly throughout the event. Laid in for some distance in the early part of the straight. Rider was advised of his obligations under AR131(b) to ride his mounts out fully to the finish.

VAMPIRE SLAYER (J. Opperman) - laid out rounding the home turn.

RACE 2: TAB MAIDEN PLATE - 1500 Metres

ICHIBANSAN (J. Holder) - laid in under pressure over the concluding stages obliging its rider to desist from riding his mount out to the finish.

OH NO GEORGE (C. Lions) - slow to begin.



RACE 2: TAB MAIDEN PLATE - 1500 Metres (cont'd)

QUEBECOIS (E. Finnegan) - had difficulty obtaining clear running from the 200 metres to approaching the 100 metres where it altered course to the outside of the heels of ROYAL GISELLE, which shifted out. Was not able to be fully tested in the run to the finish when racing in restricted room between ROYAL GISELLE, which shifted out slightly, and ICHIBANSAN, which laid in under pressure over the concluding stages.

ROYAL GISELLE (T. Pannell) - laid out under pressure over the concluding stages.

VICTORY BANDIT (E. Boyd) - passing the 1300 metres had to be steadied away from the heels of BAMYAN BUDDHA.

PAINTED ON (J. Potter) - had difficulty obtaining clear running from the 200 metres until approaching the 100 metres where it had to alter course to the outside of EROKI to continue into clear running.

EROKI (K. Sardelic) - over raced throughout the early and middle stages.

SUPERB TIME (A. Livesey) - raced wide without cover throughout the middle stages. Laid in when placed under pressure in the straight.

RACE 3: FUSE RECRUITMENT BENCHMARK 58 HANDICAP - 1700 Metres

NOT ALONE (D. Caboche) - over-raced when caught wide without cover in the early and middle stages. Rider pleaded guilty to a charge under AR132(7)(a)(ii) in that he used his whip on more than five occasions prior to the 100 metres and was reprimanded. In determining penalty Stewards had regard for the totality of the use of the whip by D. Caboche and noted that he used it on three occasions over the concluding 100 metres of the event.

TABLE OF WISDOM (B. Price) - passing the 1200 metres, when the pace slackened, had to be steadied away from the heels of MASARU WARRIOR.

GETOUTTHEWAY (R. Hurdle) - a post-race veterinary examination revealed the gelding to be exhibiting signs of mild colic. First aid administered.

DETENTORE (NZ) (D. Tootell) - slow to begin. Over-raced in the middle stages. A post-race veterinary examination revealed no visible abnormalities.

KEYSOR (S. Metcalfe) - held up for clear running from the 500 metres until approaching the 150 metres.

MASARU WARRIOR (T. Voorham) - slow to begin. Rider explained that from her wide gate her intention was to race forward or in the lead. She added that after being slow to begin she elected to push forward and lead rather than be caught wide in the early stages. She further added that MASARU WARRIOR travelled well throughout, but was disappointing when placed under pressure shortly after straightening. A post-race veterinary examination revealed no visible abnormalities. Co-trainer, Mr L. Macdonald, could offer no explanation other than that the gelding may not have run out the 1700 metres of the event.

RACE 4: CORNERSTONE STUD - HELPING PEOPLE REALISE THEIR BLOODSTOCK DREAMS BENCHMARK 54 HANDICAP - 1200 Metres

TAIPAN TOMMY (J. Potter) - trainer's representative Mr P. O'Leary, requested permission prior to the first race for the gelding to race without the tongue control bit and near-side bubble checker as declared and replace with a lugging bit. Stewards acceded to the request and acting under AR206(2) fined trainer, Mr D. O'Leary, \$200. Reared on jumping away and lost ground.

HE WILL BOOM (K. Crowther) - rider was questioned regarding the gelding leading in today's event. K. Crowther explained that the instructions issued by the stable today had been consistent with the instructions provided at previous starts; however, at previous starts the gelding had been unable to muster speed and had raced behind the leader. She added that HE WILL BOOM had previous raced in the lead when successful at Port Lincoln on 10 January 2021, and today after beginning well from her wide barrier she rode the gelding positively in order to assume the lead.



RACE 4: CORNERSTONE STUD - HELPING PEOPLE REALISE THEIR BLOODSTOCK DREAMS
BENCHMARK 54 HANDICAP - 1200 Metres (cont'd)

SHOWUSYOURMOTOR (A. Chung) - near the 250 metres had to alter course to the inside of HE WILL BOOM to continue into clear running. Laid out when placed under pressure resulting in being unable to be fully tested in the run to the finish.

SEVEN LETTERS (J. Toeroek) - passing the 800 metres commenced to over-race and laid out for some distance rounding the home turn.

STRING THEORY (D. Tourneur) - underwent a pre-race veterinary examination and was passed fit to start.

WIJDAAN (B. Price) - approaching the 1000 metres had to be steadied away from the heels of SHOWUSYOURMOTOR when taken in slightly by VEGAN.

GRAVITY (P. Gatt) - underwent a pre-race veterinary examination on arrival at the start and was passed fit to start. Rider reported that he had concerns with the gelding's action. A post-race veterinary examination revealed the gelding to be lame in the near foreleg. Trainer, Mr B. Bogarts, was advised that a Veterinary Certificate of Fitness was required prior to a future trial or race start.

RACE 5: GJ CIVIL 'ROAD TO THE JERICHO' BENCHMARK 75 HANDICAP - 3340 Metres

RAISE YOU TEN (NZ) (T. Pannell) - raced keenly throughout the event until it assumed the lead approaching the 700 metres.

BUDD FOX (D. Tourneur) - passing the 700 metres shifted out to improve resulting in BLUE BEAR having to be steadied. Rider advised to take greater care when shifting ground.

SASUN (B. Price) - lost both fore plates during the event.

ARCADIA KING (J. Potter) - a post-race veterinary examination revealed no visible abnormalities.

BLUE BEAR (S. Metcalfe) - passing the 700 metres had to be steadied when BUDD FOX shifted out to improve.

SOSTENIDO (NZ) (C. Lions) - underwent a pre-race veterinary examination and was passed fit to start. Obligated to race in restricted room for some distance passing the 700 metres between BLUE BEAR, which was taken out by BUDD FOX, and TURF MAN. A post-race veterinary examination revealed no visible abnormalities.

RACE 6: ADELAIDE PLAINS BLOODSTOCK EVANSTON SPRINT BENCHMARK 62 HCP - 1100
Metres

LARKHAM (A. Livesey) - rider explained that her instructions were to lead on the gelding, or take a sit if DAMASCUS MOMENT, which had drawn to her outside, elected to go forward. She stated that although LARKHAM was not the best to begin she pushed the gelding along for a number of strides out of the gate and then desisted; however, LARKHAM showed good early speed and then assumed the lead. She added that LARKHAM travelled well during the early and middle stages; however, approaching the home turn it changed strides on a number of strides and in the straight, and was disappointing when placed under pressure. Trainer, Mr R. Balfour, confirmed the instructions and stated that the fast early pace of the race was not to the gelding's advantage. He undertook to report back on the progress of LARKHAM in the days subsequent to the event. A post-race veterinary examination revealed no visible abnormalities.

MR RAIKKONEN (D. Caboche) - over-raced in the middle stages of the event. Lost its off hind plate in running.

SPANGIRL (A. Jordsjo) - slow to begin.





RACE 7: HOLDFAST INSURANCE GAWLER CUP – 1500 Metres

The start of this event was delayed approximately two minutes.

SECOND SLIP (NZ) (T. Pannell) – rider explained that from his wide barrier his instructions were to go forward and to have the gelding lead or sit outside the lead. He stated that SECOND SLIP (NZ) began well and he crossed from his wide barrier; however, was unable to assume the lead and as a result SECOND SLIP (NZ) was obliged to race wide throughout the early and middle stages. He added that under his big weight of 61 kg the gelding did not quicken and was disappointing in his failure to finish of the race when placed under pressure. A post-race veterinary examination revealed no visible abnormalities.

MAGNETIC EDGE (J. Maund) – approaching the 1000 metres had to be steadied away from the heels of ECHO BOOMER.

SIGN OF USSURI (B. Vorster) – laid in under pressure in the straight.

BLOW TORCH (C. Murray) – dipped, jumped awkwardly and lost ground at the start.

ALSVIOR (E. Boyd) – near the 1300 metres had to be steadied off the heels of MAGNETIC EDGE.

TUBBY TWO TRACKS (D. Caboche) – a post-race veterinary examination revealed no visible abnormalities.

ECHO BOOMER (D. Tourneur) – required to be resaddled on arrival at the barriers. Jumped away awkwardly.

ROBE BAY (P. Gatt) – proved difficult to load. Trainer, Mr P. Hardacre, was advised that the mare was now required to load without delay in an Official Barrier Trial prior to a future race start. Passing the 500 metres had to be steadied away from the heels of SIGN OF USSURI when racing tight to the inside of that runner.

RACE 8: COOPERS BREWERY BENCHMARK 54 HANDICAP – 1500 Metres

The start of this event was delayed approximately twelve minutes due to the First Care Medical personnel being required to attend to a patron on course.

EUROGEM (K. Zechner) – passing the 1200 metres had to be steadied away from the heels of ARMAMENT.

SENTRY GATE (K. Crowther) – laid in slightly and brushed with ARMAMENT near the 50 metres. Rider explained that she had lost the use of her off side rein close to the winning post.

TRIVAGO GIRL (S. Metcalfe) – shifted in several horses over the concluding stages. Rider advised that in future she would be required to stop riding and straighten her mounts sooner than she did on this occasion.

ARMAMENT (A. Jordsjo) – brushed with SETNRY GATE near the 50 metres.

WOULDA THOUGHT SO (B. Price) – underwent a pre-race veterinary examination on arrival at the barriers and found to be lame in both hind legs. Acting on this advice Stewards withdrew WOULDA THOUGHT SO at 7.06 pm. Trainer, Mr D. Saxon, was advised that a Veterinary Certificate of Fitness was required prior to a future trial or race start.
