**Report on Race Meeting held at Morphettville Racecourse**  
**by the South Australian Jockey Club on Saturday, 9 May 2015**

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**RACE 1 : PETER ELBERG FUNERALS HANDICAP - 1200 metres**

In the vicinity of the 800 metres UNDERESTIMATION (C. Lindop) shifted in and momentarily inconvenienced HIDDEN VALUE (S. Price), which had to be steadied.

From the vicinity of the 300 metres LIGHT IT UP (D. Oliver) was disappointed for clear running until approaching the 100 metres.

SALUTER was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported no visible abnormalities.

**RACE 2 : DRINK DRIVING? GROW UP HANDICAP - 1050 metres**

The start of this race was delayed approximately four minutes owing to WILD RAIN, which lost its near fore plate en route to the start, requiring Farrier attention. WILD RAIN was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who ruled the filly fit to race. DUCKWORTH, which required a minor gear adjustment on arrival at the start, was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who ruled the gelding fit to race.

BAY ROAD (J. Toeroek) jumped away very awkwardly and shortly after was inconvenienced by BLACK CAESAR (D. Dunn) as that gelding shifted out on jumping away.

PONUOGO (P. Gatt) jumped away very awkwardly and was slow to begin.

I AM GYPSY (M. Neilson) jumped away awkwardly and raced keenly in the early and middle stages of the event.

DUCKWORTH (S. Carr) laid in, in the straight, resulting in S. Carr having to stop riding and straighten her mount in the vicinity of the 200 metres.

J. Toeroek, the rider of BAY ROAD, reported owing to the manner in which the gelding began, he was unable to take up a forward position as intended and was obliged to settle further back.

## **RACE 2 : DRINK DRIVING? GROW UP HANDICAP - 1050 metres (Cont'd)**

J. Bowditch, the rider of ESCOBAR, explained the filly began better than expected and as a consequence he settled more forward than intended. He added he was obliged to race wide without cover in the early stages and from inside the 500 metres ESCOBAR was under pressure, failed to respond to his riding and over the concluding 100 metres shortened its stride and did not finish the race off. ESCOBAR was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported no visible abnormalities.

BLACK CAESAR was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported no visible abnormalities.

## **RACE 3: ROBERT & FAY GERARD HANDICAP - 1050 metres**

As the Thoroughbred Identification Card for DANGER CLOSE was not available as required by the Rules, Stewards permitted the gelding to race when they were able to identify it from records held by them. Mr. J. Warren, the Trainer of DANGER CLOSE, was fined \$100 under ARR.59A.

BRAVE JOURNEY, which slipped over in its race day stall, was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon in the stall and again on arrival at the barriers and ruled fit to race.

RIFLEMAN (P. Moloney), CLASSY JACK (J. Bowditch) and HOUSE OF WAX (T. Pannell) jumped away awkwardly.

Subsequent to the event DANGER CLOSE was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported no visible abnormalities.

BRAVE JOURNEY was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported the mare to have significant cardiac arrhythmia. Mr. G. Searle, the Trainer of BRAVE JOURNEY, was advised the results of an ECG are to be forwarded to the TRSA Veterinary Surgeon and a Veterinary Certificate of Fitness would be required prior to the mare performing satisfactorily in an Official Barrier Trial prior to accepting for a future race.

## **RACE 4 : ROTARY END POLIO NOW PROVINCIAL SUPER SERIES FINAL - 1600 metres**

THERMOGENIC (D. Tourneur) jumped away awkwardly, shifted in and contacted MISS WYNETTE (L. Nolen).

LADY SILHOUETTE (S. Price) over-raced in the early and middle stages of the event.

In the vicinity of the 500 metres FLOW METER (R. Stewart) was unable to obtain clear running for a number of strides.

C. Lindop, the rider of DR DAPPER, was questioned regarding her use of the whip prior to the 100 metres. She pleaded guilty to a charge under AR137A(5)(a)(ii) in that she used her whip in a forehand manner on more than five occasions prior to the 100 metres and was fined \$200.

MARCO POLO and WHERE'S TIM were examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported no visible abnormalities.

## **RACE 5 : HUGHES CHAUFFEURED LIMOUSINES HANDICAP - 1200 metres**

REDEEM BOUNTY (J. Toeroek) was tightened on jumping away between SNIPER FIRE (S. Carr) and ON A DREAM (J. Holder), which both shifted ground on jumping away.

## **RACE 5 : HUGHES CHAUFFEURED LIMOUSINES HANDICAP - 1200 metres (Cont'd)**

CHONDRA (A. Herrmann) laid in, in the straight.

D. Yendall, the rider of NIGHT BREEZE, reported he felt something was amiss with the gelding and for that reason did not persevere with his riding over the concluding stages. NIGHT BREEZE was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported no visible abnormalities.

CHONDRA, which returned to the mounting enclosure with blood in its mouth, was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported a minor laceration to the end of the tongue.

ON A DREAM and SATURDAY AFFAIR were examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported no visible abnormalities.

## **RACE 6 : WILLIAM HILL STAKES - 1200 metres**

On jumping away AWESOME ROCK (N. Callow) shifted out and inconvenienced IDATWO (P. Gatt).

Inside the 900 metres PITTSBURGH FLYER (V. Duric) was momentarily inconvenienced when awkwardly placed inside the heels of GET THE NOD (J. Bowditch).

At the entrance to the straight SILENT WHISPER (J. Holder) became held up for clear running when racing on the heels of BURGUNDY BLAST (C. Lindop) until in the vicinity of the 300 metres when it was obliged to shift out to obtain clear running.

Shortly after the entrance to the straight IDATWO (P. Gatt), which laid out, shifted out and tightened GET THE NOD (J. Bowditch), which had commenced to weaken, for several strides.

In the vicinity of the 200 metres IDATWO (P. Gatt), which continued to lay out, became awkward on the heels of AWESOME ROCK (N. Callow) and WE'VE GOT THIS (D. Oliver) for several strides, shifted out and tightened CONCENTRATE (P. Moloney) onto BURGUNDY BLAST (C. Lindop), which laid in and shifted in. As a consequence CONCENTRATE and BURGUNDY BLAST contacted and became unbalanced.

C. Lindop, the rider of BURGUNDY BLAST, reported the gelding hung in throughout the event. BURGUNDY BLAST was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported no visible abnormalities.

N. Callow, the rider of AWESOME ROCK, reported, in his opinion, the colt over-reached during the event and he became concerned with its action and for that reason did not persevere with his riding over the concluding stages. AWESOME ROCK was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported no visible abnormalities.

ECLAIR CHOICE and GET THE NOD were examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported no visible abnormalities.

NICOSCENE lost its off hind plate during the event.

## **RACE 7 : WILLIAM HILL SOUTH AUSTRALIAN DERBY - 2500 metres**

MAYSOOR, which kicked the rail in the mounting enclosure, was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon on arrival at the start who ruled the colt fit to race.

## **RACE 7 : WILLIAM HILL SOUTH AUSTRALIAN DERBY - 2500 metres (Cont'd)**

The start of this race was delayed approximately three minutes owing to TRIPLE GOLD, which was fractious and became cast in its barrier stall after being loaded, having to be examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who ruled the gelding fit to race.

ALL I SURVEY (R. McLeod) was slow to begin.

Passing the winning post on the first occasion BOOM TIME (V. Duric) initially shifted in and away from WERTHER (NZ) (N. Callow) as that gelding improved to its outside and brushed with TRIPLE GOLD (L. Nolen), which was taken in and tightened onto the heels of OCTOBER DATE (S. Cahill). Shortly thereafter V. Duric was obliged to check BOOM TIME when awkwardly placed between the heels of OCTOBER DATE, which had to be steadied when awkwardly placed inside the heels of CRIMSON CAPE (NZ) (M. Zahra), which was taken in by CHU CHU CHARLIE (D. Yendall) and WERTHER (NZ), which shifted in, and was unable to maintain its position. As a consequence MANAPINE (D. Dunn) became awkward for several strides inside the heels of TRIPLE GOLD and had to be steadied and ALL I SURVEY (R. McLeod), which was following, was obliged to be steadied to avoid the heels of MANAPINE. N. Callow and D. Yendall were reprimanded and advised to take greater care when shifting ground in future.

TURBO STREET (M. Neilson) raced wide without cover throughout the event.

S. Cahill, the rider of OCTOBER DATE, reported the gelding did not feel comfortable in its action throughout the event. OCTOBER DATE was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported no visible abnormalities.

M. Neilson, the rider of TURBO STREET, reported the gelding hung out throughout the event. TURBO STREET was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported the gelding to be tying up in both forelegs. First Aid was administered.

TRIPLE GOLD, which returned to the mounting enclosure with blood in its mouth, was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported no visible abnormalities.

CHU CHU CHARLIE was examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon who reported the gelding to be suffering post-race colic. First Aid was administered.

LUCQUES lost its off fore plate during the event.

## **RACE 8 : ADELAIDE GALVANISING ADELAIDE GUINEAS - 1600 metres**

EXPLOSIVE ONE (D. Yendall) jumped away awkwardly and inconvenienced PEPPER THE PIN (C. Lindop), which was tightened onto DUIBIO (S. Arnold).

TRY YOUR BEST (NZ) (P. Moloney) jumped away very awkwardly and was slow to begin.

KAPSET (D. Oliver) was slow to begin.

DEANNA JEAN (J. Potter) raced keenly in the early and middle stages of the event.

ACTUARIAT (C. Symons) was held up for clear running from in the vicinity of the 500 metres until in the vicinity of the 300 metres where it was obliged to shift to the outside of DUIBIO (S. Arnold) to obtain clear running.

TRY YOUR BEST (NZ) (P. Moloney) was unable to obtain clear running from the entrance to the straight when racing behind DEANNA JEAN (J. Potter) and to the inside of PEPPER THE PIN (C. Lindop) and was only able to obtain clear ground inside the 200 metres.

## **RACE 8 : ADELAIDE GALVANISING ADELAIDE GUINEAS - 1600 metres (Cont'd)**

Approaching the 100 metres INTO THE MIST (L. Nolen) rolled out under pressure taking MAGIC BOY (J. Holder) out onto DISTANT ROCK (N. Callow), which was taken wider on the track.

Correct Weight for this event was delayed to allow N. Callow, the rider of the second placegetter DISTANT ROCK, and Mr. S. Adams, representing Messrs L. & A. Freedman, the Co-Trainers of the gelding, to view the official footage from the entrance to the straight.

S. Arnold, the rider of DUIBIO, explained it was his intention to attempt to settle forward of mid-field with cover but found the lead by default and in his opinion the gelding is better suited racing with cover.
