THOROUGHBRED RACING S.A. LIMITED STIPENDIARY STEWARDS' REPORT

Report on Race Meeting held at Morphettville Racecourse by the South Australian Jockey Club on Saturday, 25 June 2016

TRACKS: Morphettville – Heavy 8 (Upgraded to Soft 7 @ 10.38 am) WEATHER: Fine / Overcast

Morphettville Parks – Heavy 8

RAIL: Morphettville - Out 11 metres 1200m to Winning Post, 8 metres remainder.

Morphettville Parks – out 6 metres from 1000m to Winning Post, 3 metres remainder.

RACE 1 : UBET HURDLE – 3100 (Run on Morphettville Parks track)

As no other rider was available, Stewards permitted S. Pateman to ride HONEY STEEL'S GOLD 1 kg overweight. S. Pateman was fined \$300 under AR120(b).

ABOUT THE JOURNEY (NZ) – (M. Kelly) – jumped the eighth hurdle awkwardly.

SPYING ON YOU (NZ) (R. Cully) – jumped the eighth and tenth hurdles awkwardly.

HONEY STEEL'S GOLD (S. Pateman) – required resaddling on arrival at the barriers. Jumped the fourth, fifth and eighth hurdles awkwardly. S. Pateman explained the gelding was inconsistent in the manner in which it negotiated the hurdles during the event and whilst he and the connections anticipated it might be best suited to lead, in hindsight his view was the horse may have been better suited racing further back with cover. He added HONEY STEEL'S GOLD travelled well until near the 800m and thereafter did not finish the race off as expected and was disappointing in its performance. A post-race veterinary examination revealed an over-reach injury to the near fore heel and a minor laceration to the near fore cannon.

GRASSINI (B. Small) – jumped the eighth and ninth hurdles awkwardly. Jumped the tenth hurdle awkwardly and was eased out of the event. Rider explained the gelding travelled well until jumping the ninth hurdle and after jumping the tenth hurdle, he had become concerned with the manner in which the gelding was travelling and was concerned with the gelding's action and elected to ease GRASSINI out of the event. A post-race veterinary examination revealed no visible abnormalities.

BUYMEBYCHANCE (P. Hamblin) – jumped the eighth hurdle awkwardly.

All runners were examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon following the event.

RACE 2 : SCHWEPPES THREE-YEAR-OLD MAIDEN PLATE - 1100 metres

PRECURSOR (P. Gatt) – slow to begin. Not ridden out to the finish; rider reported he felt the gelding may have choked down during the event. A post-race veterinary examination revealed no visible abnormalities.

TORCIDA (E. Finnegan) - a post-race veterinary examination revealed no visible abnormalities.

LOTTA DAME (Z. Spain) – jumped away awkwardly. Laid in, in the straight. A post-race veterinary examination revealed no visible abnormalities.

RACE 3: BEZSTECK FLOORS HANDICAP - 2044 metres

TEMPS VOLEUR (D. Caboche) – jumped away awkwardly.

CLOUDSCAPE (IRE) (J. Toeroek) - raced keenly in the early and middle stages. Eased out of the event from in the vicinity of the 500m. Rider reported the gelding raced very keenly in the early and middle stages and inside the 1000m he elected to allow CLOUDSCAPE (IRE) to stride forward, however, inside the 800m the gelding commenced to weaken and he became concerned with the manner in which it was racing and eased it out of the event. Stewards questioned J. Toeroek, Mr. B. Hayes, representing Co-Trainers Mr. D. Hayes and Mr. T. Dabernig and Mr. D. Hayes, regarding the instructions provided in respect of today's race and also the instructions provided in relation to the gelding's previous starts in Victoria. J. Toeroek advised he had been instructed to allow the gelding to settle where comfortable without fighting it, which instructions were confirmed by both Messrs. B. & D. Hayes. Mr. D. Hayes also advised that having regard for the manner in which the gelding raced at its previous starts at shorter distances and the fact that it raced over 2044m in today's event, it could have been reasonably anticipated, having regard for the gelding's racing manners, that it may very well find itself in a more forward position in running. Whilst Stewards were satisfied that there were no clear instructions provided to J. Toeroek which were different to those provided to the riders at the horse's previous starts, they nevertheless reminded the stable of the provisions of AR135A and to be mindful that the instructions as provided today may have the potential for the stable to be in breach of this Rule. A post-race veterinary examination revealed a slow recovery and excess upper respiratory noise. Mr. B. Hayes, representing Co-Trainers Mr. D. Hayes and Mr. T. Dabernig, was advised the results of a laryngoscopic examination and a Veterinary Certificate of Fitness would be required prior to presenting for a future trial or race.

CELTIC PRINCE (NZ) (P. Gatt) – slow to begin. Held up for clear running for a short distance near the 400m.

NOT A ZERPRISE (T. Pannell) - a post-race veterinary examination revealed no visible abnormalities.

POLLYWAGON (A. Doyle) – approaching the 600m obliged to be steadied to avoid the heels of CLOUDSCAPE (IRE), which commenced to give ground, and had to alter course to the outside of that gelding to obtain clear running and was hampered for a few strides thereafter.

JARRVIS (D. Tootell) – jumped away awkwardly and slow to begin.

RACE 4: ANTHONY SCOPELITIS MEMORIAL 2YO - 1200 metres

BARJEEL (P. Gatt) – inconvenienced approaching the 1000m when WASABI BOB rolled in and shifted in onto ANNIE'S SONG.

SIREN'S REWARD (H. Coffey) – inclined to lay in from inside the 200m. Rider explained the pace in this event was slower than expected and did not suit the filly and as a consequence it raced keenly in the early stages, was inclined to lay in, in the straight, and did not finish the race off as expected. A post-race veterinary examination revealed no visible abnormalities.

ZALMONA (M. Poon) – jumped away awkwardly. Raced keenly in the early and middle stages of the event. commenced to lay in shortly after the entrance to the straight and inside the 200m shifted in sharply, placing M. Poon at a disadvantage. A post-race veterinary examination revealed a slow recovery.

TUCSON ARIZONA (J. Toeroek) – raced keenly in the early and middle stages of the event and rolled out approaching the 1000m.

WASABI BOB (J. Holder) – approaching the 1000m rolled in and inconvenienced BARJEEL, which shifted in onto ANNIE'S SONG, tightening that filly onto TUCSON ARIZONA, which rolled out slightly, resulting in ANNIE'S SONG having to be steadied for a number of strides.

ANNIE'S SONG (R. Hurdle) – tightened onto TUCSON ARIZONA approaching the 1000m and had to be steadied for a number of strides.

RACE 4: ANTHONY SCOPELITIS MEMORIAL 2YO - 1200 metres (Cont'd)

IONOSPHERE (Z. Spain) – rider reported the filly was making a breathing noise during the event. A post-race veterinary examination revealed excess upper respiratory noise. Trainer Mr. G. Carter was advised the results of a laryngoscopic examination and a Veterinary Certificate of Fitness would be required prior to presenting for a future trial or race.

RACE 5 : ROBBIE SHOP HANDICAP - 1600 metres

VOLCANIC ASH (D. Tourneur) – a post-race veterinary examination revealed a lower than expected heart rate.

SPINNING DIAMOND (M. Poon) – jumped away awkwardly.

BIG BOY BLEV (J. Holder) - slow to begin. Raced keenly in the early stages of the event.

TRUPT (T. Pannell) – had blood in its mouth on arrival at the start – examined by the Club's Veterinary Surgeon and ruled fit to race.

EIGELSTEIN (GB) (J. Kah) - J. Kah pleaded guilty to a charge under AR137A(5)(a)(ii) in that she used her whip on more than five occasions prior to the 100m and was fined \$100.

RACE 6: SOUTH AUSTRALIAN PRODUCE MARKET HANDICAP - 1200 metres

MANHATTAN BLUES (J. Toeroek) - a post-race veterinary examination revealed no visible abnormalities.

COUNTER SPIN (J. Holder) – held up for clear running for a number of strides rounding the home turn and then raced in restricted room to the inside of OUR EXCHANGE shortly after the entrance to the straight.

READY SUNSHINE (T. Pannell) – raced keenly in the early and middle stages of the event.

MISS JOOLIA (A. Doyle) – hung out in the straight. Rider reported the mare raced keen early.

RACE 7: NOCELLE FOODS HANDICAP - 1050 metres

CONSERVATORIUM (Z. Spain) – inconvenienced when taken wider on the track approaching the 200m. A post-race veterinary examination revealed no visible abnormalities.

CASINO WIZARD (R. Hurdle) – inconvenienced when taken wider on the track approaching the 200m. A post-race veterinary examination revealed no visible abnormalities.

DAYTONA GREY (C. Jones) – had difficulty obtaining clear running approaching the 200m, shifted out and contacted KARACATIS, which was taken out across the running of CASHED, which had to be steadied momentarily. As a consequence of the shift of KARACATIS, CASINO WIZARD and CONSERVATORIUM were inconvenienced when taken wider. C. Jones pleaded guilty to a charge under AR137(a) in that she shifted ground when insufficiently clear and was suspended from riding in races for a period to commence at midnight on Sunday, 26 June and to conclude at midnight on Sunday, 3 July 2016; a period of three (3) meetings.

KARACATIS (M. Poon) – contacted by DAYTONA GREY, which shifted out, in the vicinity of the 200m and taken out across the running of CASHED.

CASHED (T. Pannell) – held up for clear running shortly after the entrance to the straight when racing between KARACATIS and CASINO WIZARD. Had to be steadied momentarily in the vicinity of the 200m when KARACATIS, which was taken out by DAYTONA GREY, shifted out.

LAST DAY (NZ) (J. Holder) – held up for clear running shortly after the entrance to the straight when racing behind CASINO WIZARD and was only able to obtain clear running near the 100m.

RACE 8: MAC DRINK DRIVING? GROW UP HANDICAP - 1200 metres

BOLDACIOUS GIRL (M. Poon) – raced keenly in the early stages. Inside the 800m rolled out slightly. As a consequence CORRECT CALL shifted out and inconvenienced ZUCCHERINA.

CORRECT CALL (J. Holder) – taken out inside the 800m by BOLDACIOUS GIRL, which rolled out slightly. J. Holder pleaded guilty to a charge under AR137A(5)(a)(ii) in that he used his whip on more than five occasions prior to the 100m and was fined \$100.

INFINITY QUEEN (T. Pannell) – held up for clear running for a short distance inside the 200m.

ZUCCHERINA (D. Tootell) – inconvenienced inside the 800m when CORRECT CALL was taken out by BOLDACIOUS GIRL.

FRIENDWITHBENEFITS (R. Hurdle) – laid out in the straight. A post-race veterinary examination revealed a lower than expected heart rate.
